The Division of General Internal Medicine in the Department of Medicine at the University of Pennsylvania's Perelman School of Medicine is seeking candidates for an Assistant Professor position in either the tenure track or the non-tenure clinician-educator track. Track will be commensurate with experience and academic career plan. Applicants must have an M.D. degree and have demonstrated excellent qualifications in research, clinical care, and education. They must also be board-certified or board-eligible in internal medicine, have completed extensive, formal training in research methods, and have demonstrated exceptional promise for a career as a leading, independent investigator.

The successful candidate will be responsible for building a research program in areas of high relevance for general internal medicine, including but not limited to health policy research, comparative effectiveness research, health economics, behavioral economics, health psychology, clinical, genetic or social epidemiology, medical sociology, and disease prevention or early detection. He or she will also provide direct patient care in either the inpatient or outpatient setting, and he/she will have opportunities for teaching in the Perelman School of Medicine's outstanding educational programs at the UME, GME or post-graduate level.

The Division of General Internal Medicine at the Perelman School of Medicine provides exceptional opportunities for developing a career as an independent investigator, including the support of Penn's Leonard Davis Institute of Health Economics, the Center for Clinical Epidemiology and Biostatistics, the Abramson Cancer Center, the Center for Public Health Initiatives, the Center for Health Incentives and Behavioral Economics, the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation Clinical Scholars Program, and strong collaborations with the other health oriented schools at the University of Pennsylvania including the Wharton School and the Annenberg School of Communication.
