The Center for Child Health Care Studies in the Department of Population Medicine, Harvard Medical School and Harvard Pilgrim Health Care Institute, is seeking a faculty member in child health care services research for a full-time position as Instructor or Assistant Professor.

The Center is a vibrant research group that currently includes seven faculty members in child health services research. Areas of ongoing investigation include vaccine safety, decision making and cost-effectiveness analysis, treatment and prevention of childhood infections, asthma and health policy evaluations. Center investigators are also conducting studies of community based interventions for culturally diverse populations. The incoming faculty member should have several years of experience in research and is expected to assess areas of ongoing research and/or establish new areas of expertise for the Center.

Besides his/her principal research activity, the faculty member will also participate in mentoring research fellows and teaching, and in the broader mission of the Department of Population Medicine. The Department is uniquely positioned as a research and teaching group with joint support from a medical school and a large non-profit health plan. It has a multi disciplinary faculty with a research portfolio that spans a wide range of clinical, epidemiologic, and health service delivery areas.
