

**Postdoctoral Fellowship(s) Positions in Epidemiology and Global Health

POST-DOCTORAL positions available for one year, with possibility of renewal, to work with the Emory Global Diabetes Research Center (GDRC) led by Dr. K.M. Venkat Narayan, Ruth and O.C. Hubert Professor of Global Health and Epidemiology in the Hubert Department of Global Health, Rollins School of Public Health, Emory University, Atlanta, USA.

The Emory Global Diabetes Research Center has established partnerships with significant collaborators in diabetes and cardiovascular disease (CVD) research in the US and globally. As a result, Fellows will be involved in large and innovative observational and intervention studies of diabetes and CVD etiology, prevention and treatment. Fellows will also have the opportunity to work with a number of faculty at GDRC (e.g., Drs. Mohammed Ali, Neil Mehta, Solveig Cunningham and others). Exciting scientific challenges and opportunities for career progression are available for motivated, high quality candidates.

Research activities may include complex modeling and analysis related to CVD, longitudinal study of diabetes and CVD, systematic reviews and meta-analyses, preparing study protocols, study design and implementation, publishing in peer-reviewed journals, oversight of junior researchers, and grant writing.

We are seeking candidates with a medical or doctoral degree in epidemiology or related health field with substantive knowledge of diabetes, obesity, and CVD. Candidates must have strong quantitative background; the ability to work independently and collaboratively; strong organizational and record keeping skills; fluent English writing and verbal skills; inter-disciplinary attitude; and creative mindset are preferred.
