Candidates should possess an MD or MD/PhD and have a diverse background that spans aging research, biomedical informatics and/or health services research. In addition to the titles of President and Chief Executive Officer, the successful candidate will be an appointed faculty member at the IUSM.

The Regenstrief Foundation was established in 1969 by business man and philanthropist Sam Regenstrief and in 2002, the Regenstrief Institute was established as a support organization to the Indiana University School of Medicine. With Regenstrief as the convener of thought leaders for the future of health care, the possibilities for innovation and research partnerships across disciplines are limitless and appeal to innovators both locally and globally. The institute is highly successful in funding from federal grants and contracts awarded by the National Library of Medicine, national philanthropies, Indianapolis healthcare institutions, and other sources.

Now home to over 50 investigators, the Regenstrief Institute is home to three prestigious programs. The Center for Aging Research develops, tests, and implements innovative strategies for improving the quality and efficiency of healthcare and self-care for medically and socially vulnerable older adults. The Center for Health Services Research works to improve healthcare delivery and health outcomes of patients through research on patient safety, quality of care, patient-provider communication strategies, applied health information technologies, system redesign, and health profession practice and education research. The Center for Biomedical Informatics (CBMI) is a global collaborative research and learning organization, developing and evaluating innovative informatics solutions to improve patient care and translate these solutions into cost-effective, operational systems, including a dynamic electronic medical record system. The Indiana Network for Patient Care (INPC) is a 35-year-old health information exchange operated in Indiana. INPC is the nation's largest health information exchange (HIE) that contains over 4.6 billion structured observations and 165 million text documents for over 17.2 million patients. The INPC includes data from over 80 hospitals and captures 68% of the Indiana population.

The Regenstrief Institute is located on the IUSM campus in Indianapolis and will be moving in November 2015 to a newly constructed facility close to collaborative research partners including Eskenazi Hospital, The Indiana Clinical and Translational Sciences Institute (CTSI), IU Health hospitals, the Indiana Health Information Exchange and the Roudebush VA Medical Center. The Regenstrief Institute also hosts the Regenstrief Biomedical Informatics Fellowship Program and the World Health Organization's Collaborating Center for the Design, Application and Research of Medical Information Systems. The Regenstrief Institute is the founding and main support site for OpenMRS which has been implemented in more than 50 countries on 5 continents.
