Training and experience is required in any of the following: health services research; shared decision-making; patient preferences; self-management; systems improvement; quality of care; clinical informatics or healthcare disparities. The faculty member will hold an academic appointment through the University of Cincinnati's College of Medicine and the Center for Innovation in Chronic Care. Successful candidates should have strong potential to develop an externally funded research program.
