- Provide methodological and scientific contributions for up to 10 writing committees; individually provide research assistance for up to five guideline writing committees including literature review and appropriateness/consistency of citations.
- Create and maintain evidence tables; analyze data, conduct secondary analysis such as NNT, NNH and 95% CIs; and create algorithms, including development of care pathways and/or flow charts.
- Monitor and assess new developments in evidence-based medicine, guideline methodologies, clinical and health services research, and technology assessment
- Continually monitor the medical literature, including the circulation of trial summaries for determining the need to update current clinical policy
- Maintain topic-based literature databases, and provide literature reports to appropriate guideline writing committees
- Maintain oversight of, and adherence to, the guideline methodology and maintain the publicly available methodology manual for development of practice guidelines
