

Academic General Internal Medicine. The Dartmouth Institute for Health Policy and Clinical Practice (TDI) and Dartmouth-Hitchcock Medical Center (DHMC) seek candidates for appointment at the Assistant Professor level as Clinician-Investigators. Clinical responsibilities could lie in primary care or in hospital medicine. The successful applicant will join an interdisciplinary research group that includes physicians, economists, sociologists and statisticians and analysts in TDI's Center for Health Policy Research with a clinical appointment in the Department of Medicine. Although there is substantial flexibility in the specific research questions that could be pursued by the applicant, the expectation is that the applicant would develop independent research that is well-aligned with ongoing projects focused on the causes and consequences of regional, racial and socioeconomic disparities in practice, spending and health. Because TDI has developed what is probably the largest Medicare claims research database outside the federal government, we are particularly interested in candidates with interest and experience with these or other similar databases, such as the Medicare-SEER database, or private health insurance claims files. Additional roles could include mentoring research fellows or PhD students, teaching in the undergraduate, medical or post-graduate (MPH, PhD) programs of TDI.
