The Department of Pediatrics is seeking faculty candidates for Co-Director of the Title V Child Health Specialty Clinics (CHSC). CHSC is Iowa's statewide program for children with special health care needs under the Maternal & Child Health Block Grant, Iowa Department of Public Health.

Appointment will be at the rank of Assistant Professor, Associate Professor, or Professor (clinical or tenure track), depending upon qualifications.

Required qualifications

Pediatrician (board certified or board eligible) and MPH, MPA, MHA, or public health experience or equivalency and demonstrated leadership experience.

Desired qualifications:

Public speaking

Excellent written and verbal communication skills

Previous work in an interdisciplinary model of care

Experience in child advocacy and collaborative systems of care

The Co-Director will share leadership with the Chief Administrative Officer of CHSC, and will have shared responsibility for public health policy, child advocacy and regionalized clinical services, and will assume the duties of Medical Director to the Iowa Department of Public Health, Division of Health Promotion and Chronic Disease Prevention. Responsibilities also include participation in Title V strategic planning, be the Principal Investigator for discretionary grants, and provide vision for emerging public health issues. Opportunities exist in the Department of Pediatrics for teaching, clinical services, and public health research. Responsibilities require regular state and national travel.
